

Directions:

Subway: From the Main Train Station („Hauptbahnhof“): Take subway train **U4** (direction „Seckbacher Landstraße“) or **U5** (direction „Preungesheim“) for 1 stop (train station „Willy-Brandt-Platz“). From there, take subway train U1, U2, U3 or U8 (note: you can take any subway EXCEPT direction „Südbahnhof“) and disembark at „Holzhausenstraße/Uni Campus Westend“. From there it is a 5-minute walk to campus.

Bus: From the Southside of the Main Train Station („Hauptbahnhof Südseite“) Take bus 64 (direction „Ginnheim“) to „Bremer Straße“. From the city centre: Take bus 36 (direction „Westbahnhof“) from „Konstablerwache“ to „Uni Campus Westend“. Plan your local trip on: www.rmv.de/en/
